

## Our community has 3 major anxieties:

- 1. about vulnerable villagers
- 2. about the environment
- 3. about access to the Construction Compound

These concerns only relate to the project's construction phase

For each of these we will state the concern then make a suggestion to address it (14 slides of text/ photos follow)

## **Concern #1: Vulnerable parishioners**



#### **Problem:**

- Ufton: a village split by the main A425, with a blind bend at the roundabout. Exceeding the 30mph speed limit is a real issue
- the population has a high % of 65+
- crossing the road to get to/ from: church, village hall, bus stops, pub, shop, Nature Reserve.
- HS2 and Warks CC accept that traffic volume data isn't the best
- HS2 data shows construction will add 1020 HGVs per week

## **Ufton's Request**

Reduce risk to our parishioners by asking HS2 to fund a pelican crossing

(Cost £60K + £40k/ 15yrs maintenance)

# Concern #2: impact of traffic and getting the tunnel boring machine in place





#### **Problem:**

- St Michael and All Angels Church, Ufton, is a vulnerable asset
- Saxon church recorded in 1043, but current Grade II\* hasorigins in 13th Century
- A425 trunk road is in a cutting to the west of the church
- Lower part of cutting is banked; higher part's retaining wall protects church and graveyard
- GCA Consulting "Structural Appraisal: Retaining Wall to the Church" July 2012 expresses grave concerns about its structural stability
- Concerns also expressed about potential damage to the nearby roundabout





















## **Proposal**


### Please, *before* construction begins:


## **Problem:**


## CFA16- Request to change haul route near Ufton Village

- to discuss with us, and review the decision on the proposed access to the construction site.
