The ecology surveys will be conducted on 20 June and 21 June 2023, then on 3 July to 4 July 2023 from 9:30am to 3:30pm.

Their working hours will be from 9:30am to 3:30pm Monday to Friday. The workforce may be on site one hour before and one hour after to set up and secure their equipment.

#Recycle Right

Empty your small internal kitchen caddy into your external food caddy every couple of days or so as the food nears the lid. This will reduce the chances of mould and smells when the food breaks down.

Also, now the weather is getting warmer, it is important to make sure food is not left uncovered before going into your caddy, if a fly lands on uncovered food they could lay eggs which may lead to maggots. Keep your caddy clean and make sure

the lid is tightly closed on your indoor and outdoor caddies.
